
UK's trajectory towards open research continues

<u>UKRI strategy</u> champions open research in three areas:

- open access to publications;
- open data, software, methods and protocols;
- open culture by reforming incentives and research assessment, recognising and supporting related skills and teams.

"UKRI aims to achieve open research data that is 'findable', accessible, interoperable and re-useable, (the FAIR Data Principles)."

"usually we expect you to make your data as open as possible and only closed when necessary"






